SCRIPTURE READING • John 11:38-44

³⁸ Then Jesus, deeply moved again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay against it. ³⁹ Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, by this time there will be an odor, for he has been dead four days." ⁴⁰ Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?" ⁴¹ So they took away the stone. SERMON • “Ain’t No Grave” Rev. Brad Allison

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and ends with Easter Sunday, bookends that highlight two features of Christianity. We trust and obey Jesus as our King (Palm Sunday) and we are filled with hope that all things will be made new (Easter). The raising of Lazarus from the dead happens just days before Holy Week, but it foreshadows the resurrection to come on Easter Sunday. This is the seventh and climactic miracle of Jesus recorded in John’s Gospel. We can almost feel Hell shaking as Jesus orders the stone to be taken away. The reign of terror from Satan, holding people in bondage to the fear of death, will soon be ended. Jesus comes to us today, as he came to his friends Mary, Martha and Lazarus, ministering the incredibly good news of resurrection life. I note four features of this ministry.

I. Patience

II. Truth (to Martha)

III. Emotional Connection (to Mary)

IV. An Invitation to Faith
