SERMON • "Advent Lamentation" Clint Cyacho

On this first Sunday in Advent, we focus on preparing our hearts for the birth of Jesus Christ, as God came to dwell with His people in a land of darkness in order to shine the light of life among broken sinners. As we enter the Christmas season, with its lights and frantic celebrations, the brokenness of the world is even more glaring. The presence of sickness, death, disunity, and want stand out more starkly than at other times of the year, and we are reminded that this is not the way it was supposed to be. Thus, a season that should be filled with great joy becomes a time of great lament for many of us. Today we will enter into David's lamentation as we examine Psalm 13 in light of the Incarnation. We will face the darkness in the reality that the Light has come.
