PASTORAL PRAYER

This morning's anthem is based on the title spiritual, the 16th century German chorale, "Wake, Awake, the Night is Flying," and the early 20th century African-American song, "This Little Light of Mine." The song alludes to the Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins (found in Matthew 25:1-13) where they await the return of the bridegroom. The wise virgins, who brought extra oil for their lamps, are ready and prepared; the foolish virgins, who did not bring extra oil, find themselves left behind when the aroom arrives. So we too are wise if we are ready when the bridegroom, Jesus Christ, returns, And what does it mean to be ready? We must be born again through saving faith in Jesus Christ. (John 3:3-5,16)

SERMON • "Life in Paradise" Rev. Brad Allison

In our series on the "One Another" commands of the New Testament, we come today to this command to "stir up one another to love and good works." The assumption implicit in this command is that there is great potential for good in our relationships with one another. God has put within the church a capacity for us to help one another even with this greatest command to love. This verb "stir up" can carry a negative meaning, in the sense of provoking someone to anger. We sometimes say of a troubled marriage, "They know how to push one another's buttons." But it is used here in a positive sense. Our passage begins with language that takes us back to the main storyline of the Bible, a story that begins in the paradise of Eden.
