SCRIPTURE READING • Esther 4:12-17

And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" ¹⁵ Then Esther told them to reply to Mordecai, ¹⁶ "Go, gather all the Jews to be found in Susa, and hold a fast on my behalf, and do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. I and my young women will also fast as you do. Then I will go to the king, though it is against the law, and if I perish, I perish." ¹⁷ Mordecai then went away and did everything as Esther had ordered him.

SERMON • “An Exile’s Story” Rev. Brad Allison

Christians are citizens of both the common kingdom and the redemptive kingdom. As we saw in Jeremiah 29 last week, we are exiles in the common kingdom because our home is in the redemptive kingdom. Much of our work lives is spent in the common kingdom, and we are commanded to seek the good of that kingdom where we live as exiles. Jeremiah gave us the command, and in today’s passage Esther gives us a real-life story about life as an exile. She lived in the Persian kingdom and ended up as Queen of the entire land. She neither separated from the Persians nor assimilated to their values, but remembered that she was first of all a citizen of Israel. Her life supplies us with three important principles for our work in what we are calling the common kingdom.

I. Expect Opposition

II. Don’t Be Afraid of Powerful Opponents

III. Fear God Alone
