SCRIPTURE READING • I Corinthians 7:17- 24

¹⁷ Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him, and to which God has called him. This is my rule in all the churches. ¹⁸ Was anyone at the time of his call already circumcised? Let him not seek to remove the marks of circumcision. Was anyone at the time of his call uncircumcised? Let him not seek circumcision. ¹⁹ For neither circumcision counts for anything nor uncircumcision, but keeping the commandments of God. ²⁰ Each one should remain in the condition in which he was called. ²¹ Were you a bondservant when called? Do not be concerned about it. (But if you can gain your freedom, avail yourself of the opportunity.) ²² For he who was called in the Lord as a bondservant is a freedman of the Lord. Likewise he who was free when called is a bondservant of Christ. ²³ You were bought with a price; do not become bondservants of men. ²⁴ So, brothers, in whatever condition each was called, there let him remain with God.

SERMON • “Work and Status” Rev. Brad Allison

In our final sermon in our series on work we are going to address a common question. “How can I know what God has called me to do?” In contrast to last week’s topic on laziness, when I mentioned that I have never been asked to help someone deal with that sin, this topic is just the opposite. Every pastor has been asked many times by people to help them know God’s will for their lives, whether it’s in the area of their occupation, a marriage partner, or many other areas of life. Paul addresses this question in today’s passage, in the larger context of talking about marriage and divorce. He answers by addressing the issue of status. His main point is that we don’t make these decisions to boost our status in the world, because, for the Christian, status is something we receive and not something we achieve. He draws out three implications of this idea.

I. Be Reluctant to Change

II. Be Willing to Change

III. Receive Your Status
