SERMON • "A Welcoming Community" Rev. Brad Allison

I'm so thankful to be a part of a church with a core value of being a welcoming community. A core value is a God-given strength, and God has gifted our church with this value. Though this is a strength of our church, there is still much room for improvement. So today we are going to consider one verse from Hebrews. "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares" (13:2). Though the word "welcome" is not used here, the idea is present in this notion of hospitality. It means literally a love of strangers. It is the welcome extended to outsiders by those who are insiders.
