Please be in prayer for some staffing needs we are experiencing at the church. Our bookkeeper of 28 years, Jimmie Campbell, recently gave us her resignation, effective April 28. Jimmie has been a faithful and hard-working employee for many years, and we will miss her. We also received a resignation notice from Scott Taylor, who has been serving as our custodian for about a year now. Those with an eye for such things have noticed the cleanliness of our building during Scott's time with us. Those of us who are on campus for large amounts of time always see Scott working hard but also greeting us with a kind and respectful greeting. If you know of anyone who might be interested in applying to either of these jobs, check out the job descriptions on the church website for specific information about these openings.

In addition to these two resignations, two other employees have had to be away for extensive periods of time. Our Church Administrator, Christine Rowlette, had some major surgery on February 19 and has been out of the office since February 15. As of the date of writing this (March 15), she has not yet been able to return. Please pray for healing. Our Youth Director, Clint Cvacho, has been attending to his mother's serious health needs since her surgery on February 22. As of today, she remains in ICU, and her recovery is still uncertain. Clint is an only child, and his mother has no husband, so much of his mother's care falls to him. Clint told me, by the way, how significant it has been for him to be on the receiving end of the love of the church during this time.

So your church staff is operating a little short-handed right now. Many have stepped up to help out, and we are thankful. God often does his work through our weakness, and it seems that we are experiencing an opportunity for that to happen right now.



CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

During the Sunday School brunch, I shared I am praying I will be a Godly old woman when I grow up and for Jamie to become a Godly old man. I have also been praying this prayer for you and for each of the children under the umbrella of AVPC Kids' Ministry.

I am currently enrolled in the PCA's children's ministry director certification program. This past week I was struck in class when the instructor shared research that although strategic Biblical discipleship and training throughout childhood is a major component in a child's future relationship within the church, an equally foundational factor is the adult relationships a child has within the church body throughout



their childhood and youth. When a covenant child has one, two, or three safe, authentic relationships with adults in their home church outside of their family, the probability of that child continuing as a future vibrant member of both the universal and local church is astoundingly greater. Translated into AVPC lingo, God has designed a crucial role for YOU to play in the present and future lives of the little ones wiggling beside you in the pew, which in turn impacts God's coming kingdom!

At the brunch, Pastor Brad challenged each of us to identify and commit to praying for one AVPC child outside of your family. Reach out or even introduce yourself to the child's parents and ask ways you can be praying.

Finally, you'll notice I have begun signing my emails and letters with a phrase Sue Jakes shared with me, "For Christ's Crown and Covenant." These words have become an anchoring filter in all of life, but particularly here at AVPC. I long for each encounter, activity, conversation, etc. to echo the present and future glory of our Savior's reign and promises.

YOUTH HAPPENINGS

Lent this year has been a season of intense shock, grief, and suffering. My mother went in for a routine surgery and had a cascading series of complications that led to intense suffering, a literal near-death experience, and now a long recovery. I spent a few nights at the hospital, watching my mom suffering and wondering if this would be the end for her as I wrestled with fear, grief, and anger. It was during one of those moments, wondering where my Lord and Savior was, that the description of Jesus from Isaiah 53 came to mind: "He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows..." In that moment, the Holy Spirit reminded me that Jesus was there with my mother and with me. He not only knows what was happening, but He knows exactly what it feels like.

The reality is that many of us are suffering right now, whether it be physically, emotionally, or spiritually. What a gift it is that we have a Savior and we follow a Lord who willingly endured the horrors of this fallen world for us. Think about it. Jesus' death on the cross was the fulfillment of all those sacrifices in the tabernacle and temple for centuries. Lambs that were sacrificed were killed quickly, they were not abused and beaten. Jesus could have just come and lived a perfect life, died a quick death, and still accomplished our salvation. Instead, He chose to be one of us, fully. Are you suffering in some way physically? Jesus knows what that pain feels like personally. Are you afraid? Jesus knows what it is like to be afraid to the point of sweating blood. Have you been misunderstood or betrayed? Jesus knows what that feels like. As we look to the cross and the empty tomb this Easter, we can be assured that Jesus is with us during the suffering that we encounter in this world. None of this is surprising to Him, as He assured us that we would have suffering in the world. However, Jesus followed this with a greater promise: He has overcome the world! Friend, Jesus knows you wherever you are and He is in control!






MISSIONS NEWS






