NEW HOSPITALITY MINISTRY COMING IN MAY 2024

You may have heard that there are upcoming changes in our Greeter Ministry and Usher Ministry. We hope the questions and answers below will help you better understand the changes that are coming.

What changes will be made to the Greeters and Usher Ministries?

Our plan is to merge these two ministries into one Hospitality Ministry that will (a) greet and assist visitors before and after both services, (b) hand out bulletins, (c) take up the offering, (d) hand out gifts to first-time visitors, and (e) carry out other responsibilities currently assigned to the Greeters or Ushers.

Why are these changes being made?

One of AVPC's core values is to be a welcoming community. Since both the Greeters and Ushers share many of the same responsibilities (e.g., welcoming and providing support for our visitors before Sunday morning worship), we believe combining these ministries will help us to be more effective in welcoming people into our worship services and church family.

Who will be serving on the Hospitality Ministry?

Jim Baird and Marsha Wakefield have graciously agreed to lead this ministry for the upcoming year. The ministry will also include: (a) Adult men and women; (b) Youth ages 15 and older; (c) Children grade 3 - age 14 who will be invited to serve as "junior partners" with adult members; (d) Families who will be encouraged to serve together. We anticipate there will be 6 - 7 people per worship service.

When will the Hospitality Ministry begin?

May 5 in both services. This is also Youth Sunday, so you can expect to see several teenagers helping.

It looks fairly certain now that the 2024 Presidential election will be a repeat of the 2020 election, with the current incumbent Joe Biden facing the previous incumbent Donald Trump. With the likelihood of this race bringing about even greater division in our nation, and possibly in the church as well, I think it's a good time to review what the Bible says about Christians and politics. Though much could be said about this, I want to come at this by noting two errors we are to avoid, the errors of withdrawal and entanglement.

It is sometimes tempting for Christians to think that they can withdraw from politics and focus exclusively on preaching the gospel and making disciples. But such an approach means that we simply accept the status quo within our communities and nation. The problem with that is that the status quo in our fallen world often includes injustices that the Bible requires us to address. If Christians in our nation had withdrawn from such injustices and focused exclusively on preaching the gospel, we would still have slavery and forced racial segregation. But Christians did get involved because the Bible commands us to do so. We are to seek the welfare of our communities (Jer. 29:7). We are to be the preserving and illuminating factors of salt and light (Matt. 5:13-16). We are to pray for peace and seek peace (1 Tim. 2:1-3), for it is in times of relative peace instead of times of chaos that the gospel tends to flourish.

The second error is that of entanglement, by which the church becomes identified with one political party. This has happened repeatedly throughout church history, and it has never ended well for the church. The damage that is done to the church arises from the fact that the church gets tainted with the shortcomings and injustices that always emerge when people get power. We are seeing that happen today with Christian nationalism, by which some Christians would have the church identified with the Republican party. While the church can and should take stands on moral issues like abortion, racism, transgenderism, and justice and mercy for the poor, we must be careful not to take positions on matters that are more issues of prudence and wisdom. For example, some believe that the best way to help the poor is to shrink government and let the private sector help, while others believe the best way is to increase the role of government in poverty alleviation. Though many have tried, it would be difficult to make a biblical case for either of these options over the other. That's not to say that there is no answer to this question about the best way to help the poor, only that it is a matter of prudence and wisdom and not something commanded in the Bible.

A general principle that I find helpful in protecting against both of these errors is that political engagement should be something done by individual Christians and not by the church. In any case, we can all agree that this is the time to be praying for peace in our sharply divided nation.

I ALWAYS THOUGHT IT WOULD BE GREAT TO... own horses and have a horse farm.

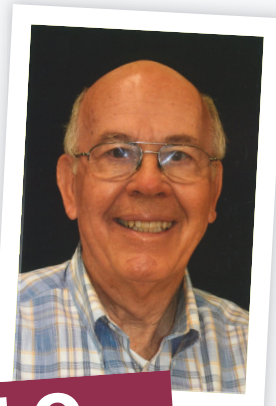
WHEN I HAVE FREE TIME I ENJOY... being outside and in the mountains or by the seashore.

What a beautiful spring this has been thus far! I have been enthralled watching the blooming of the daffodils, the budding of the cherry trees and pear trees, and excited as I watched the trees coming back to life from their annual winter death. I have been thankful for both the rain and the sunshine as examples of God's goodness to us. Why this overly-enthusiastic response to spring this year? Perhaps it is because this time last year I watched my mother on the brink of death, spending most of the spring myself in the intensive care unit watching her struggle to live. This time two years ago I went through an intense season of darkness, enduring betrayal on multiple levels. As we entered 2024, I found myself involuntarily feeling a sense of dread about what would be coming next.

By God's grace, He is showing me this spring that light, indeed, drives out darkness. He is showing me that "the little things," i.e. the everyday moments we take for granted are actually the "big things." He is showing me His faithfulness through faithful friends and brothers and sisters in Christ holding fast amid suffering of their own. God is using the glory of rebirth found in Creation every spring to highlight the rebirth Paul speaks of in Jesus. "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." (2 Corinthians 4:6) Just as Creation started with God calling light out of the dark void of nothingness, our lives began, truly began, when Jesus called light out of the dark void of our sinful hearts. As we bask in the warming sun and marvel at the explosion of life in the natural world around us this spring, may we even more so bask in the warmth of the Holy Spirit and marvel at the explosion of life within each one of us. May we continue to shine as lights into the dark places in this world.
