Pastor's Pen

Brad Allison, Senior Pastor

I wrote in this space last month about all the changes we are experiencing at Altadena currently. We are not the only ones, and I want to write again to inform you about the changes other PCA congregations in the Birmingham area are undergoing and invite your prayers for them as well. As you know, Briarwood lost their Senior Pastor, Harry Reeder, in a traffic accident earlier this year. They just recently called an Interim Pastor to help them through the next year or two of transition. Dan Doriani will be filling that role. Dr. Doriani is currently serving as a professor of theology at Covenant Theological Seminary. He also pastored Central Presbyterian Church in St. Louis for a time. Please be in prayer for him and for Briarwood during this challenging transitional season.

Oak Mountain Presbyterian just called and installed their new Senior Pastor. Caleb Click comes from Perimeter Church and will take up his new role in January. He was just approved by our presbytery in November. Bob Flayhart is the founding pastor of this church, where he has served for over thirty years. Following a long-tenured founding pastor is particularly challenging, so keep this church in your prayers as well. Cahaba Park Church in Liberty Park also has a new pastor. Claude McRoberts began serving there earlier this fall, also following that church's founding pastor, Murray Lee. Claude most recently served as pastor of Trinity Presbyterian in Montgomery.

Christ Church in Trussville is losing their Senior and founding Pastor, James Dickson. He will be taking up a position at Covenant Seminary. And, of course, our church is in the same situation, though I'm not a founding pastor of this 170-year-old church. All these changes remind us of our need to trust God and pray to him for the welfare of these precious churches. Transitions of senior pastors also remind us that no one is indispensable in a church except for Jesus (and he promises that he's not going anywhere!). So as you pray for Altadena's transition, don't forget to pray also for our brothers and sisters at these other Birmingham PCA churches.

SESSION MEETING • OCTOBER 17, 2023

- **Discussion of the recommendations from the staff and the Worship Ministry Team on the roles of women in the church:**
 - **Increase awareness of the Session's 1998 paper (revised 2023) on the role of women in the church at the November Sunday School brunch.**
 - **Use the shepherding process of the church to shepherd women and men to minister in roles for which they are biblically eligible.**
 - **The initial recommendation of the Worship Ministry Team was to allow a broader demographic of the congregation, including women and families in the church's usher ministry. The Worship Ministry Team is to bring their plan for implementation to a future Session meeting for approval.**
- **First draft of the 2024 Budget**
- **Matt and Lauren Hall, joining the church by reaffirmation of faith.**

DIACONATE MEETING • NOVEMBER 14, 2023

- **Hunter Boggs is not going to chair the Diaconate next year and invited other Diaconate members to consider nominations of a new chair.**
- **Facility Team Report: Jefferson County will replace Acton Creek bridge. Motion was made and unanimously approved to sell the land to the county.**
- **A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously approved that the Designated Diaconal Fund be replenished to equal a total amount of \$16,500.00 from the 2023 budget surplus.**



Preliminary copies of the General Fund Budget are now available. You can find a copy of the budget in the Parlor, Welcome Center, or by scanning the QR code below.




MISSIONS NEWS
