Pastor's Pen Brad Allison, Senior Pastor

It is beyond doubt that the evangelical church in our nation is encountering some trouble at present. We see the influence of the church waning, and this decline is supported by the numbers. In 2007, 78 percent of Americans identified as Christians. Just fourteen years later, in 2021, that number had declined to just 63 percent. It is generally accepted that sometime in the middle of the next decade that number will be below 50 percent, and Christianity will be a minority religion. Though we would all like to see these trends reversed, and we pray that they will, I'm more concerned with how we respond to them. Will we respond in a way that makes things worse, or will we respond as God's faithful people who trust him in both the good times and the bad?

What would be a wrong response to this decline? In a word, it would be fear. Fear leads us to do the wrong things. It might lead some to trust in the politicians to reverse this decline. Fear might lead others just to give up, retreat to our foxholes and wait for the end. I read a verse from John's gospel lately that caught my attention. In John 12:43, Jesus said, "for they loved the glory that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God." Who was he talking about? The previous verse answers that question. "Nevertheless, many even of the authorities believed in him, but for fear of the Pharisees they did not confess it, so that they would not be put out of the synagogue."

Jesus here cuts to the heart of our fears. We love the glory of man more than the glory God gives. Notice that Jesus here is not talking about the glory God receives, which is his due. He is talking about the glory God gives. What a sharp contrast between the glory man gives and the glory God gives! It may be that the church in America is receiving less glory from man. Many have gone from indifference to hostility to us and our beliefs. As a result, the church may lose some money and some influence. But what are we really losing if we still have the glorious gifts of God? As we enter a new year, may God help us do so with no fear but with confidence in our God. Jesus has been raised from the dead and is seated on his heavenly throne. We are death and resurrection people. Let us not forget that.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

At AVPC, we are continually praying for God to root our covenant children for future flourishing. Our teachers, volunteers, staff, and Session view this space of children's ministry as a sacred one. I am grateful for our leadership recognizing the resources this area has been requiring for some time, acknowledging the needs of our families and culture, and responding in faith and grace. As we enter a year that will present new chapters for Altadena Valley, let's give thanks that He alone is our provider, and He will show Himself in ways that will be for our good and His glory.
