

WHAT IS Worship Arts Camp?

As Christians, we come together to worship God every Sunday. But is that all worship should mean to us? From Romans 12, we know that offering our bodies as 'living sacrifices' is our spiritual act of worship. Is that something we can do one morning a week and be done? Worship Arts Camp for Kids (WACK) is an opportunity for your children to see worship as more than just a Sunday morning activity, but as a way of living that honors God above all else.

We also believe God has created us in his image. Therefore, all of us have the creative gift within us. This camp is an opportunity to show your children that using our creativity in a way that honors God is itself an act of worship. They will have the chance to explore various areas of visual and performing arts and will be given instruction on how to use their artistic gifts. Most importantly, they will be guided in directing praise for the arts to the Creator and not to the creation. At Worship Arts Camp your children will put into practice what the Psalmist commands us to do: "Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; worship the Lord in the splendor of his holiness." 
