

YOUTH HAPPENINGS

As I engage in student ministry and as I live in a household with one student left, my year does not revolve around the 12-month calendar, but around the 10-month school year. Thus, I am currently kicking off a "new year." As such, I have spent time recently praying over what my theme would be in student ministry as well as my personal life this school year, and the Lord kept bringing me back to the word "trust". We are all in a season of transition here at church as we await a new pastor, and I find myself in a season of uncertainty and transition as we sent our daughter off to college (our first) and are now trying to get used to not having her in the house as well as trying to figure out how we are going to pay for it all! What about you, what are you tempted to fear right now? Is it a new year at school full of new classes and teachers (with new expectations)? Is it a new job? Is it changes at your current job? Is it a looming home repair? Is it a looming medical test or the fallout from a medical test that has just been performed? Is the anxiety caused by the simple act of grocery shopping right now as you try to reconcile the few things in your cart with the exorbitant amount the cashier just quoted you? Is it the prospect of Harris winning in November? Is it the prospect of Trump winning in November? Is it the prospect that either has to win?

I recently read a story about a man who had the chance to meet Mother Teresa and asked her to pray for him. His prayer request was that the Lord would give him direction. She responded by saying she would not pray for direction but, rather, that the Lord would give him greater trust. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding." (Proverbs 3:5) This is such a well known verse, but one that is so hard to live out. As I engage with life and all the reasons for fear listed above, my own understanding is what I most naturally lean on, in spite of the fact that the end result is usually failure and/or fear. This school year, I want to let go of fear and I want to rest in the Lord, I want to trust God, to fully trust Him with my life, my resources, and my choices. Join me in this journey of trust and feel free to encourage me by sharing ways you find yourself trusting in the Lord with all your heart and not leaning on your understanding. I would love to be on this journey with you!
